CLOTHING

We need you to help us stay above reproach in all areas of dress. What may not be a problem in the USA can be an identification problem in their culture. Please help us rise above personal preferences to overcome any perception problems that can occur in a cross-culture ministry.

It is early fall there with the reverse seasons. Weather will generally be 30-40 degrees in the mornings and nights, and 40-50 degrees in the day time. Please dress modestly at all times. Sunday attire for church is below knee length dresses or skirts for girls and dress slacks (no jeans) for boys. In addition, boys should wear tie or nice sweater on Sunday with dress shoes. (No sandals or tennis shoes) Other days the dress code will be causal. We want you to be comfortable, but not offensive in any way. Dress for the airport is causal except for <u>no</u> shorts. Light jacket is suggested for the flight from Miami to Buenos Aires.

You will need one pair of khakis and 2 pair of nice jeans. You should have comfortable shoes for the ministry days. WE ARE PRAYING FOR NO RAIN DURING OUR MINISTRY DAYS, but you may want to bring an umbrella for other days in case of rain. Do not bring excessive jewelry that could be a target for theft on the streets.

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<u>GIRLS</u>: No short dresses, skirts, or shirts (i.e. 2 inches above the knee, stomach showing, etc.) Bathrobes or large towels to use going to showers down the hall. No extreme hair styles or colors, or excessive rings, etc. No baggy clothing.

<u>BOYS</u>: No baggy clothing, earrings, extreme jewelry (necklaces, pocket or neck chains, etc.) No hats in buildings or in concert programs. Hair should be neat and not excessively long as to draw attention (head or face). You can grow it back when you come home.
